

Writer - Daniel Jamieson

Daniel has worked with Theatre Alibi as Associate Writer and adaptor, performer and Artistic Director. In 2015 he won an ACA award for his writing for children with Theatre Alibi. His work as a writer includes St Thomas Story Tours, I Believe in Unicorns, Table Mates, Apple John, The Boy Who Climbed Into the Moon, Fish Eye, Olive & the Dream Train, Falling, Hammer & Tongs, Mucky Pup, Curiosity Shop, Goucher's War, Cabbage Heart, Deep Down Cowboys, The Night Before Christmas (an RSC commission), The Swell, Sea of Faces and Birthday. Daniel's play The Flying Lovers of Vitebsk was produced by Kneehigh Theatre and won the Carol Tambor Best of Edinburgh Award at the 2017 Edinburgh Festival, touring nationally and internationally in 2018. Daniel has written five plays for BBC Radio 4 and has also written for Polka Theatre, London Bubble, Theatre Royal Plymouth and Northampton Theatres. In 2013 Daniel was Leverhulme Artist-in-Residence at the University of Exeter's Mood Disorders Centre. In 2018 he helped Doctor Sam Willis and Professor James Daybell turn their 'Histories of the Unexpected' books into performance lectures which they take to literary and history festivals around the country.

Nikki Sved is Theatre Alibi's Artistic Director. Nikki has also taught at Exeter University Drama Department. She is Chair of Exeter Culture and a member of the Steering Group for Exeter UNESCO City of Literature.

Designer - Trina Bramman

Trina studied Theatre Design at Nottingham Trent University. She has worked on a number of productions with Theatre Alibi including I Believe in Unicorns, Table Mates, The Boy Who Climbed into the Moon, Olive & the Dream Train, Mucky Pup, Falling, Hammer & Tongs, The Crowstarver, Goucher's War, The Ministry of Fear, Cabbage Heart, Deep Down Cowboys, A Flying Visit, High Muck -a-Muck, Cobbo, Bonjour Bob and Wild One. She was Assistant Designer on the first production of The Crowstarver and Design Assistant and Propmaker on productions including Spies, You Can't Catch Me, Close to Home, Teapot, In One Ear & Out the Other and Why the Whales Came. Other more recent work includes prop and costume design for Jagprops and sculptural installations for Wollaton Hall and Newstead Abbey. She has also worked as a prop maker for Dragon Breath Theatre, a model maker for Aardman Animations and Warp X and as a model making tutor at Nottingham Trent University.



Performer - Kirsty Cox

Kirsty trained at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland. Her recent theatre work includes I Believe in Unicorns, Apple John, The Boy Who Climbed Into The Moon and Olive and the Dream Train (Theatre Alibi), Our Church (The Watermill Theatre), Crimes, Camera, Action and Crimes on the Nile (New Old Friends), The Odyssey and Medusa (Bristol Old Vic), The Macbeth Curse (Prime Theatre/Bolton Octagon), The Last Post (Kilter Theatre) and the one woman show Stalin's Daughter (Blue Brook Productions). She is a regular performer with street theatre company, The Naturals, and the comedy improvisation group, Instant Wit. She has recorded several audiobooks and also radio drama for BBC Radio 4. Her film and television experience includes Trollied (Sky TV), commercials for Toolstation and Visit Wales, and several independent feature films.
